01	Ex 4:21	✓			<i>The LORD said to Moses, "When you go back to Egypt see that you perform before Pharaoh all the wonders which I have put in your power; but <u>I will harden his heart</u> so that he will not let the people go.</i>
02	Ex 7:3	✓			<i>But <u>I will harden Pharaoh's heart</u> that I may multiply My signs and My wonders in the land of Egypt. (This is grace to the Egyptians)</i>
03	Ex 7:13		✓		<i>Yet Pharaoh's heart <u>was hardened</u>, and he did not listen to them, as the LORD had said.</i>
04	Ex 7:22		✓		<i>But the magicians of Egypt did the same with their secret arts; and <u>Pharaoh's heart was hardened</u>, and he did not listen to them, as the LORD had said.</i>
05	Ex 8:15			✓	<i>But when Pharaoh saw that there was relief, <u>he hardened his heart</u> and did not listen to them, as the LORD had said.</i>
06	Ex 8:19		✓		<i>Then the magicians said to Pharaoh, "This is the finger of God." But <u>Pharaoh's heart was hardened</u>, and he did not listen to them, as the LORD had said.</i>
07	Ex 8:32			✓	<i>But <u>Pharaoh hardened his heart</u> this time also, and he did not let the people go.</i>
08	Ex 9:7		✓		<i>Pharaoh sent, and behold, there was not even one of the livestock of Israel dead. But <u>the heart of Pharaoh was hardened</u>, and he did not let the people go.</i>
09	Ex 9:12	✓			<i>And <u>the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart</u>, and he did not listen to them, just as the LORD had spoken to Moses.</i>
10	Ex 9:34			✓	<i>But when Pharaoh saw that the rain and the hail and the thunder had ceased, <u>he sinned again and hardened his heart</u>, he and his servants.</i>
11	Ex 9:35		✓		<i><u>Pharaoh's heart was hardened</u>, and he did not let the sons of Israel go, just as the LORD had spoken through Moses.</i>
12	Ex 10:1	✓			<i>Then the LORD said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh, for <u>I have hardened his heart</u> and the heart of his servants, <u>that I may perform these signs of Mine among them</u>." Here is a clear purpose statement!</i>
13	Ex 10:20	✓			<i>But <u>the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart</u>, and he did not let the sons of Israel go.</i>
14	Ex 10:27	✓			<i>But <u>the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart</u>, and he was not willing to let them go.</i>
15	Ex 11:10	✓			<i>Moses and Aaron performed all these wonders before Pharaoh; yet <u>the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart</u>, and he did not let the sons of Israel go out of his land.</i>
16	Ex 14:4	✓			<i>"Thus <u>I will harden Pharaoh's heart</u>, and he will chase after them; and I will be honored through Pharaoh and all his army, and the Egyptians will know that I am the LORD." And they did so.</i>

17	Ex 14:8	✓			<u>The LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh,</u> king of Egypt, and he chased after the sons of Israel - - -
18	Ex 14:17	✓			As for Me, behold, <u>I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians</u> so that they will go in after them; and I will be honored through Pharaoh and all his army, through his chariots and his horsemen.
19	Rom 9:15-18	(✓) Implied			For He says to Moses, "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion." So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy. For the Scripture says of Pharaoh, " <u>For this very purpose I raised you up, to demonstrate My power in you, and that My name might be proclaimed throughout the whole earth.</u> "

Rom 11:1-8 I say then, **God has not rejected His people, has He? May it never be!** For I too am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, of the tribe of Benjamin. ²God has not rejected His people whom He foreknew. Or do you not know what the Scripture says in the passage about Elijah, how he pleads with God against Israel? ³Lord, THEY HAVE KILLED YOUR PROPHETS, THEY HAVE TORN DOWN YOUR ALTARS, AND I ALONE AM LEFT, AND THEY ARE SEEKING MY LIFE." ⁴But what is the divine response to him? "I HAVE KEPT for Myself SEVEN THOUSAND MEN WHO HAVE NOT BOWED THE KNEE TO BAAL." ⁵In the same way then, **there has also come to be at the present time a remnant according to God's gracious choice.** ⁶But if it is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works, otherwise grace is no longer grace. ⁷What then? What Israel is seeking, it has not obtained, **but those who were chosen obtained it, and the rest were hardened;** ⁸just as it is written, "**GOD GAVE THEM A SPIRIT OF STUPOR, EYES TO SEE NOT AND EARS TO HEAR NOT, DOWN TO THIS VERY DAY.**" See Isaiah 29:10-14!

This passage suggests strongly in "Double Predestination" or what is known as the second half of Double Predestination, "Reprobation".
