Sandals, Shield and Helmet (Ephesians 6:15-17a)

15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; (NASB)

Wuest: and having sandalled your feet with a firm foundation of the good news of peace;

The picture is of the need to **stand against** the schemes of the devil – vs. 11 (not walking or running)

Two possible meaning for the verse – either that:

- the gospel is the firm foundation on which Christians are to stand or
- that the Christian soldier should be ready to go out to defend and spread the gospel Isa 52:7; Rom. 10:15

We desperately need the firm footing of the <u>personal application</u> of the <u>gospel of peace</u> in order to stand firm against the schemes of the devil – otherwise we will slip, slide, and give ground.

We do not stand firmly on the gospel of peace when, usually in the midst of suffering:

- we doubt the goodness of God as the giver of the gospel
- we doubt that the gospel has actually been applied to us
- we doubt that the gospel really brings us to a place of peace with our God

Instead, we want to strap on the gospel of peace and personally apply it as our foundation from which to stand firm

16 in addition to all, taking up the shield of faith with which you will be able to extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one.

Should be, in addition to all

Shield – almost the size of a door flaming arrows – their purpose:

The shield was even more effective when all used theirs together

FAITH: Must be shown by obedience

The object of our faith (not bare faith alone) makes it protective

How to Take up the Shield of Faith

- knowing Scripture passages Rom. 10:17
- **knowing doctrine** the big picture of Who God is, what He is doing, and how He chooses to do it Jer. 9:24
- experiencing the faithfulness of God, especially in suffering Lam. 3:17-25; Rom. 8:35,37
- Position the shield between you and the fiery dart coming your way

- Use it to shield your brethren
- Beware of the random shot, just when you think you're out of danger 1Kings22:34
- Keep the shield regularly watered by the Word

When you take it up, you will be able (or enabled – passive voice) to extinguish all...

17a And take the helmet of salvation... - 1 Thess. 5:8-11

Hope = confident, eagerly anticipated expectation

In what ways does Satan come at our head (our thinking)?

- Doubt/confusion
- Discouragement/despair
- Empty philosophies/confident assertions Col. 2:8; 1 Tim. 6:20
- **Peer pressure** "everybody knows..."
- Ridiculing, questioning, twisting Scripture

How does the helmet of (hope of) salvation protect our head?

SALVATION: the already and the not yet

- assurance of our accomplished salvation
- expectancy of final salvation Rom. 13:11-14

In the end, God wins, and we with Him
